


Today's home learning is about converting units of time.

Units of time are the different ways we

measure time passing, they include hours, minutes and seconds.

There are 60 seconds in one minute and 60 minutes in one hour. To convert from hours to minutes and minutes to seconds, you multiply by 6o. To convert from seconds to minutes and minutes to hours, you divide by 6o.



Additionally, units of time are also days, weeks, months and years. You can then convert between these units ie 21 days is 3 weeks.
