
Eucharistic Prayer for children

- Polar bears live in the Arctic.
- Polar bears have black skin and although their fur appears white, it is actually transparent.
- It is the largest carnivore (meat eater) that lives on land.
- · Polar bears use sea ice as a platform to hunt seals.
- · Seals make up most of a polar bears diet.
- Male polar bears can weigh up to 680 kg (1500 lb).
- Female polar bears usually only weigh about half as much as males.
- Polar bears spend most of their time at sea.
- Scientists estimate that there are around 20000 polar bears.
- Polar bears have 42 teeth.
- · The scientific name for the polar bear is 'ursus maritimus'.
- Polar bears keep warm thanks to nearly 10 cm of blubber under the skin.
- Polar bears have an excellent sense of smell, with the ability to detect seals nearly a mile away (1.6 km).
- Polar bears can reach speeds up to 40 kph (25 mph) on land and 10 kph (6 mph) in water.
- The polar bear was the mascot for the 1988 Winter Olympics in Calgary, Canada.

 Paint your hand with one of your flower colours and gently press your hand onto the top of your paper.



Repeat 2 or 3 times, overlapping your handprints a little. You could try both hands to try different colours. Don't forget to wash your hands!



 Paint some long green lines onto the bottom of each handprint to be the stems of your flowers, and leave to dry.



 Next, dip your finger into some orange or yellow paint and create some finger prints in the middle of each flower print and leave it to dry again.



Once your paint is dry you can add a ribbon to your bouquet. Ask an adult to help you tie a bow into the ribbon and then stick it onto the stems of your flowers.



Once your flowers are dry write a message on your card to show who your handprint bouquet is for.

Most of all have great fun making your handprints and giving your card to your family.
