Writing Unit Structure

Each writing unit has a balance of experience lessons, sentence stacking, and independent writing lessons to build upon skills and prior knowledge. The number of days covered within each unit will vary depending on the genre or text type.

Experience Days	Used to gather and explore vocabulary through the writing lenses. Children take part in practical activities and immerse themselves in the genre of text. These lessons could also be used to highlight text structure and writing intent.

Spelling (Cycle A Y2)



Spelling is taught on a 2-week cycle in Year 2 once children have successfully completed the Read Write Inc phonics programme. In week 1, children investigate an area of spelling and practice KS1 spelling words. In week 2, children complete 1 revision lesson and 4 lessons which consist of short spelling tasks linked to the spelling rainbow.

<u>Reading</u>



Reading is taught over a two-weekly cycle for children who have successfully completed the Read Write Inc phonics programme. Children have 2.5 hours of taught reading sessions per week plus daily reading for pleasure. Pupils who are still accessing the phonics programme will be taught reading through their phonics sessions.
