They will learn about line, pressure and tone as they produce their own landscapes and still life drawings. In the sculpture and painting units' pupils will continue to build on prior knowledge of colour mixing as they learn about the colour wheel and explore the use of shape, line, texture and patterns to create their own African masks. They will continue to learn about the work of Van Gogh and be introduced to more artists e.g. Cezanne, Kandinsky and Delaunay.</li> </ul>
