Pupils to experiment with performing a variety of sounds 	 <u>Curriculum Unit Links</u> Keep a steady pulse in a group and be able to pick out two different tempos in music. Repeat back short basic rhythms and perform rhythmic ostinatos. Sing back short melodies that use 2 pitched notes and develop the concept of pattern work in music using rhythm grids. Identifying features of a range of high quality and recorded music, replicating basic rhythms heard. Play basic rhythms on untuned percussion instruments and using body percussion. Introduce tempos. Sing simple folk tunes in unison both with and without accompaniment or backing tracks. Improvise simple rhythms based on given stimuli (e.g. rhythm grids).
