At St. Mary Magdalen's, we passionately believe that children build strong foundations for learning through play and exploration. We provide opportunities for the children to learn from real-life experiences, in a context they can relate to, building on needs and next steps as we go. The use of Forest School is developing and our spiritual garden is used for times of quiet reflection. We strongly believe that EYFS is a vital stage in the development of the whole child and therefore ensure we give every child the best start we possibly can.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding our pupils is our number one priority. We are a listening school and staff are trained in Safeguarding procedures. Our Headteacher and our Deputy Headteacher are our Designated Safeguarding Officers and all school staff have undertaken training in safeguarding and child protection. We work closely with Durham Counciland Clennell Education Solutions Safeguarding teams.

SEND

Staff are supported by a highly skilled SEND Co-ordinator within school who oversees the whole provision. We may also seek advice and recommendations from other professionals to ensure our pupils are getting the best support

Best practice involves clear communication between home and school. Parents/carers are involved in every stage as your voice is valued and is integral to how we support your child. The child's voice is meaningful and essential to ensure a happy school life.

Our Community

Our Uniform



Summer uniform (Easter - October 1/2 term) optional

- Light blue buttoned school shirt
- Navy tie
- Navy jumper or cardigan
- Grey or navy trousers/navy knee-length flared skirt or pinafore
- White/black or grey plain socks or navy tights
- Black shoes (no trainers)

Winter uniform (after October 1/2 term - Easter)

- Light blue polo t-shirt
- Navy jumper or cardigan
- Grey or navy trouser or shorts/knee length flared skirt or pinafore or blue and white summer dress
- White/black or grey plain socks or navy tights
- Black shoes (no trainers)
- No tie required

P.E. Kit - On PE days, pupils should wear full school PE kit to come to school:

- Light blue plain t-shirt,
- navy shorts/leggings or joggers,
- navy PE hoody and trainers (not school shoes).

Children should wear trainers and keep plimsolls in school for indoor use. Outdoor trainers should provide support for pupils when exercising so trainers such as Converse would not be appropriate. Preloved uniform is available please contact the school office.



Chadwick's Kitchen



Our award winning in-house catering team Chadwick's Kitchen, provide catering services across the Trust.

We use fresh ingredients to prepare healthy and nutritionally balanced meals each day. The majority of our menus are homemade by our chefs in our kitchens.

Staff are trained to accommodate medical diets and work in partnership with parents to ensure these needs are met. As part of the Trust's commitment to sustainability, we regularly review food miles and continue to work to reduce food waste.

Parents/Carers can pay for school meals using ParentPay, and can view meal choices and account balance online. This operates via a biometric (finger scanning) process, improving efficiency and removing the need for cash.

Students entitled to free meals are allowed to purchase food to the value of a free school meal allowance daily. Students also have the option to bring a packed lunch (nuts or nut-based products aren't permitted). Find out more: www.bccet.org.uk/chadwicks-kitchen/
